Unit 1: The New World

Combined Time Line

Directions: Sometimes it's hard to make connections between events that are happening in different parts of the world at the same time. Here is a good way to make those connections for the events you've been learning about in this unit. Make a "combined time line", in the form of a chart. You may put the chart together any way you want as long as all requirements are met. You might be surprised to see what's happening at the same times in opposite sections of the globe. Follow this pattern:

Years	Americas	Africa	Europe	Asia

Requirements:

- 7 different years of your choice between 1400 and 1600
- A clear description of the event that is happening as close to that year as possible in each of the four sections of the world
- Descriptions must be at least three complete sentences long
- One picture to go with your chart (drawn yourself, from magazine, or from Internet)
- A bibliography that includes all of the sources you used (at least two sources must be books)
- The chart above is only an example of how to set it up; do not use it; create your own unique chart!
